Amazing Foster Volunteers

Foster volunteers provide temporary care for dogs and cats at SoHumane who for a variety of reasons need to live in a home environment prior to adoption. Foster homes are often needed for nursing cats and their kittens or for litters of puppies. Older dogs and cats may need a quiet place away from the kennel environment for a period of time. Animals who have recently had surgery or are undergoing special medical treatment may recover more quickly in a foster home. And sometimes an emergency creates a need for a temporary home for a dog or cat.



Kai came to SoHumane from a situation where he developed a fear of people. While we do many things at SoHumane so the dogs feel safe and enjoy their stay, our facility is not ideal. Kai was overlooked by potential adopters because of his behavior in the kennel environment. He is thriving in his foster home where he lives with three other dogs and three cats. Kai's foster mom said, *"We foster dogs who are too anxious or stressed to show their shining personalities in the shelter. Welcoming an animal into our home allows the animal to feel safe enough to be themselves so that the world can see how amazing they truly are. We also love that by fostering one animal two are saved; the one we are fostering and the one who gets the spot at the shelter."*

At SoHumane, one of our primary needs is for foster volunteers who will care for kittens. We receive hundreds of calls every year from people who have found or want to surrender kittens.

Most of them are too young and small to be adopted. They need a foster home where they can safely grow and develop. The very youngest may require round the clock care. According to Estrella Cervantes, Intake Supervisor, *"SoHumane would not survive kitten season without foster homes. Countless kittens would go without care and would likely not live without a foster family to care for them."*

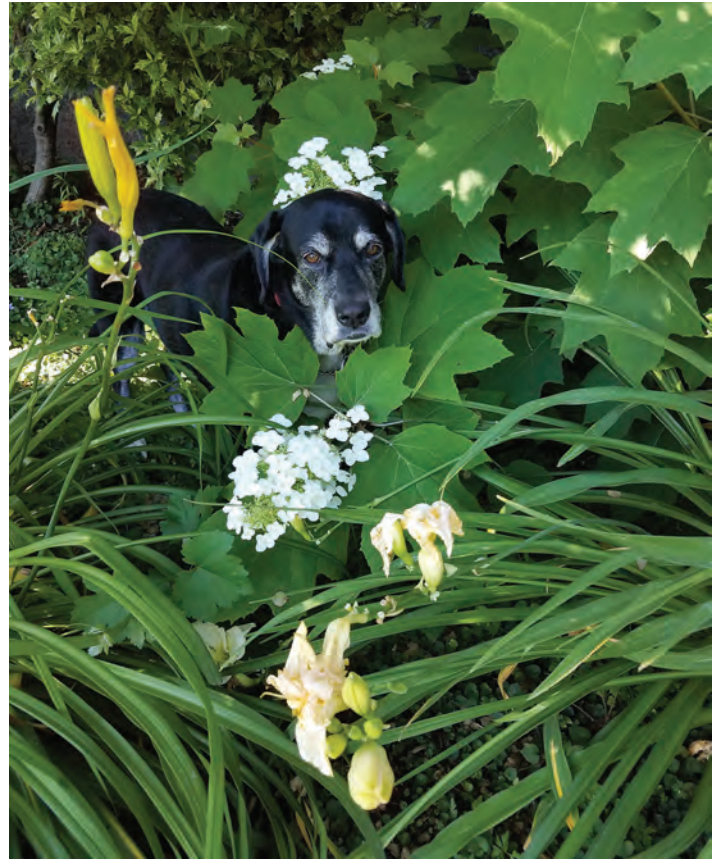

Is Your Pet “Too Well-Loved?”

Pet obesity is a terrible problem.

At times you may wish that you had someone controlling your food intake as it would make dieting easier! Well, pets have us, caring for them, monitoring their food and treats, so there is no reason they should be overweight, and certainly not obese, right? Wrong! A

2017 survey by the Association for Pet Obesity Prevention found that 60% of cats nationwide were overweight or obese. Overweight or obese dogs topped 56% nationwide. Those numbers are surprising, but even more astonishing is the fact that many pets classified as obese by veterinarians were considered by their owners to be in the normal weight range.

An animal of normal weight should have ribs that are palpable without excess fat covering, a waist when viewed from above, and an abdomen that tucks when viewed from the side.

It is not always easy or comfortable to discuss a pet's weight during a veterinary exam, but overweight pets are at risk for health concerns and are much more prone to:

- Type 2 diabetes (three times more likely in obese cats than normal cats)
- Respiratory disease, such as asthma
- Heart disease
- Joint and soft tissue problems, such as osteoarthritis and cruciate ligament injury
- High blood pressure
- Many types of cancers
- Heat intolerance

In fact, research has shown that the life expectancy of an overweight pet is decreased by 2.5 years. If I could give my dog 2.5 extra years of life by keeping her a healthy weight, I would do it in a heartbeat! Let's talk about how. First off, let's look at some more interesting facts provided

by Hill's Science Diet and Royal Canin. Did you know that:

- 1 Milk Bone large dog biscuit fed to a 60 pound dog is the same as an adult human eating 1 regular Snickers bar?
- 1 medium Purina Busy Bone fed to a 40 pound dog is similar to an adult human eating 4 Egg McMuffins?
- A 1 inch cube of cheddar cheese fed to a cat is equivalent to an adult human eating 3 Hershey's chocolate bars?

It is always best to discuss a weight loss plan for your pet with your veterinarian in case there are any underlying health concerns at play. That said, here are some simple ideas to help your pet maintain a healthy weight:

- Measure your pet's food.
- Feed healthy treats.
- Do not free feed.
- Break one biscuit in smaller pieces and give as treats throughout the day.
- Walk, play with or pet your furry friend.
- For sedentary cats, move the food bowl regularly so that the act of eating takes effort.
- Weigh your pet frequently -- many vet offices will happily weigh your animal for no charge to monitor weight loss.

Look at your pet with a discerning eye. As stewards of your pets' health, it is up to you to ensure they maintain a healthy weight and are comfortable, happy and live a long life. They give us so much -- how can we let them down?



A Life Saving Journey



Bright and early in the morning the Saving Train arrived at SoHumane with a load of homeless pets. An excited group of staff and volunteers quickly unloaded the animal crates and began taking the individual dogs to their assigned kennels where fresh water and food was waiting. Some pups were eager to run and jump and greet the day, while others were unsure of what was to come. They had all completed the first leg of their journey. Soon each would be ready to meet the person or people who would welcome them as the newest member of their family.

Saving Train rescues are an amazing collaboration between SoHumane, overcrowded shelters, generous individuals and businesses, and the people who offer a loving forever home. In 2004 the Southern Oregon Humane Society saw a need to lend a helping hand to animals

who had run out of options at regional shelters. In response to this cry for help, staff and volunteers started making frequent trips to high-kill shelters, driving hundreds of miles through Oregon and California to bring back animals who were at death's door due to time and space limitations. The concept of the "Saving Train" was born. The Saving Train became an official program in 2005, and in 2007 a donated bus allowed large groups of animals to be rescued. The vehicles have changed but the goal remains the same – to save more lives. Many generous individuals and businesses contribute to keeping the Saving Train running. Your gift saves lives!

Southern Oregon Subaru is the Toast for Tails Saving Train sponsor and hosts the annual Share the Love adoption event in December where so many rescued dogs are adopted before the holidays.

Bella's new mom says, "She absolutely completes our lives. It truly was meant to be!"

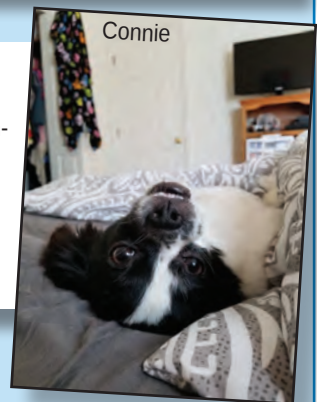

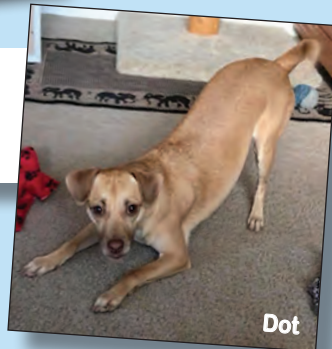


Update on Jax, He's doing great! So far, out of all the places we've taken him, the beach has been his favorite!

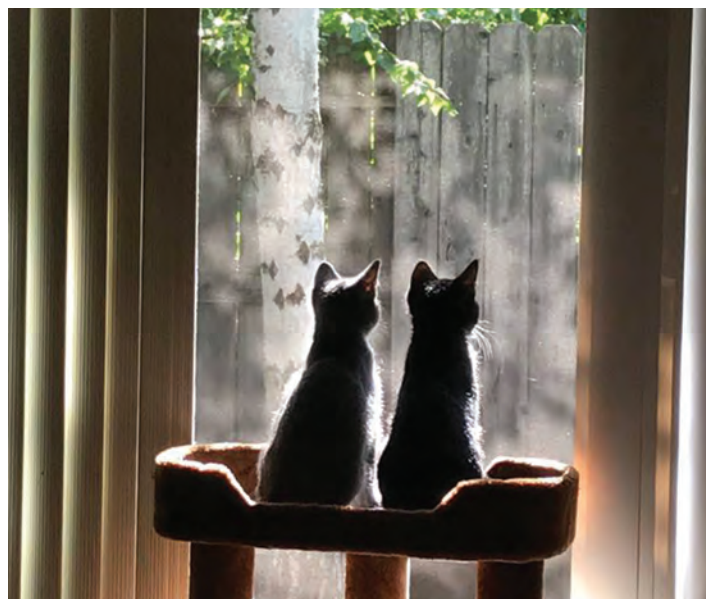
