The Gift Of A Home

SoHumane is honored to be a safe haven for animals whose guardians can no longer care for them. In 2017, 54% of the pets that came into our care were from our own local

we are thrilled to be celebrating 90 years of lifesaving service. SoHumane receives no tax dollars or government funding. Over 70% of our funds come from gifts from people like

community. **Thanks to you, SoHumane found homes for 1,587 dogs and cats through the Adoption Program.** The number of senior pets and bully breeds that were given a second chance at a loving home increased for the second year in a row. The Saving Train made regular trips to partner shelters to transfer pets, thereby reducing the number of animals euthanized for time or space. More critical medical care for animals in need was provided, and 797 spay/neuter surgeries were performed. Behind those figures are dogs and cats now with loving, forever homes. You made these new families possible.

Your generous gifts to the dogs and cats in our care is essential. Founded in 1928,

Shy Dogs Blossom at SoHumane

Often dogs arrive at an animal shelter very scared and shut down. The busy kennel environment can be stressful for new dogs, especially ones that are timid. At SoHumane we work hard to ensure that all of the dogs and cats feel safe and comfortable, especially those pets that are shy. During intake a dog's behavior is carefully evaluated. When dogs are accepted into our adoption program we immediately begin working with them to help them feel safe.



Our first step is to set up a warm soft bed with food and water in their kennel. We then assign a PAL to each dog. The pal is usually a student that spends time with a specific dog and interacts with the dog in a non-confrontational way. The pal will sit with the dog in the kennel, pet the dog if it wants to be petted, read to the dog, and take the dog out for exercise.

The next step is to introduce a dog to our enrichment program. This includes receiving a busy bucket, participating in playgroups, going for walks, spending time in the agility area, and more. These activities help the dogs in many ways. Not only do they boost their confidence, enrichment activities allow them to display normal dog behaviors such as playing, chewing, and running.

Playgroup is one of the most fun ways to see dogs burst out of their shells. Dogs are social animals, and in playgroup they get to experience normal interactions with people while having a blast romping with their new friends. The dogs

are also able to relax during these times which reduces stress experienced during their stay. Typically in a matter of days these shy and timid dogs blossom into social butterflies and are subsequently adopted. Once in a while it will take a little longer for a dog to feel comfortable and secure. A shy or timid dog may spend time in a foster home to gain confidence. Some dogs will stay in foster care until they are adopted, and others will be with a foster family for a few weeks

and then come back to SoHumane. Because of our extensive volunteer, enrichment, and foster programs SoHumane is able to find permanent homes for shy dogs that typically might be overlooked and remain in a small public shelter for months.

Every animal is spayed or neutered before going home. Adoptions include an ID microchip, initial vaccines, parasite preventative, a courtesy veterinarian exam and plenty of post-adoption support.

Parasites and Your Pet

Spring is upon us and with these warm, sunny days come a few things we could do without. Pests of all types are about -- ticks, fleas, mosquitoes, worms, giardia and mites, to name a few. Let's talk about the potential for and how to prevent parasitic infection in your pets. Remember,

many of these parasites can cause zoonotic disease, which is disease that can be transmitted from pets to people. Also, direct transmission of disease from these parasites to people can occur. Protecting your four-legged family member, and thus all of your family members, from these parasites is crucial!

Fleas and Ticks

Fleas and ticks are external parasites usually picked up in the environment. They transmit disease by biting your pet. A number of tick-borne diseases cause serious pet and human illness. Fleas are the most common external parasite of dogs and cats and cause flea-allergy dermatitis, which is manifested by intense scratching of and chewing on the skin. Flea bites can also cause anemia, and, in cats, Bartonellosis, which is zoonotic. Topical or oral preventatives are effective ways to kill fleas and ticks on your pets. Environmental decontamination is necessary to rid your surroundings of flea infestations.

Mosquitoes

Heartworm disease is a life-threatening infection caused by the adult stage of

the parasite *Dirofilaria immitis*. Spread by mosquitoes, it causes inflammation of the pulmonary arteries, may damage the heart, liver and kidneys, and ultimately causes death if left untreated.

Extremely expensive and painful to treat (using arsenic-based injections deep in the muscles of the back), heartworm disease is simple to prevent with a once-a-month chewable tablet that generally costs about \$6 to \$12 a month depending on the size of your pet. Southern Oregon is the heartworm hotspot of the state. Heartworm preventative should be given year-round in Southern Oregon.

Worms

Roundworms and hookworms cause gastrointestinal disease in animals, but, importantly, are also considered zoonotic.

Roundworms can cause liver, lung and eye disease in humans, especially children, while hookworms can migrate within the skin of people, causing intensely itchy skin lesions. Many people do not realize that most oral heartworm preventatives also have the added benefit of protection against roundworms and hookworms.

Whipworms and tapeworms are also gastrointestinal parasites. Commonly, tapeworms are found in pets that have fleas, as fleas serve a crucial role in the tapeworm life cycle. Whipworms are contracted from soil or contaminated dog feces. Tapeworms must be treated by special medications generally not found in heartworm preventatives. Some heartworm preventatives kill whipworms.

Giardia is a protozoal parasite acquired through the consumption of stagnant water or water contaminated with feces. It can cause diarrhea



in dogs and people, but dog giardia does not normally infect people. Cleaning up pet feces promptly greatly reduces the chances of your dog getting giardia.

Mites

There are several species of mites that can infect pets. Ear mites are most often found in outdoor cats. They are tiny mites that live in the ear canal and multiply by the thousands, causing ear infections and extremely itchy ear canals. Demodex mites are commensal organisms in dogs and cats. However, if the pet undergoes periods of stress its immune system may not be able to naturally control the mites. If this occurs, the pet is said to have mange and may require treatment. Sarcoptes mites are less common but zoonotic, causing intense itching in pets and people and a condition known as scabies. Proper husbandry and nutrition for pets goes a long way to preventing mite infestations.

Talk to your veterinarian about how to best protect your pet from parasites. There are easy things to do and preventative medications to help fight against these and other parasites. Your pets will thank you, and your family will too!

Jewel is Magick

How did “Jewel” (her name in the Adoption Center) get there? Really not known, but originally she did love to jump into whatever vehicle had its door open.
